


Board Bullets

Highlights of the Cherokee County Board of Education Meeting Thursday, May 11, 2017

- Beginning at 6 pm, Ms. Wanda Arrowood called the meeting to order and welcomed all present.
- Mr. Tim Coffey led the pledge of allegiance.
- Mr. Jeff Tatham read the mission statement.
- The agenda was accepted as presented.
- The Minutes from the April 6, 2017 board meeting were approved as presented.
- Ms. Arrowood called for public comment. There was none.
- Raymond Hollenbeck and Ryan Shell, students of TCEC, appeared before the Board and delivered a presentation as part of their Senior Capstone project on the use of technology in schools. During their presentation the students explained why they were interested in technology being utilized in the schools, how efficiently the technology is being used, and their likes; and in conclusion their speculations on how technology could be used differently, more effectively and in a manner that reached a broader range of students.
- Mr. Keith Payne, Assistant Principal of Murphy Middle appeared and presented a request to name the Murphy High School track complex in honor of Ms. Frankie Roberson and Mr. Benny Pipes. Mr. Payne's presentation outlined their many accomplishments as coaches of track and field. The
 - Board approved naming of the MHS track complex as requested. The complex will now be known as "The Roberson-Pipes Track".



- Dr. Jeana Conley presented the proposed 2017-2018 school year calendars for CCS and TCEC. The calendars were approved with a start date of August 28, 2017.
- Mr. Winfield Clonts delivered a report from the Financial Planning Subcommittee meeting held May 4, 2017.
 During his report, Mr. Clonts addressed the following items the Financial Planning Subcommittee heard, discussed, and/or approved:
 - The FPS recommends awarding of the milk bid to the Mayfield Co.
 - 1) The Board approved awarding the milk bid to the Mayfield Co.
 - AHS Cafeteria Roof Project. The FPS approved option A (Membrane Roof for an estimated \$210,000) and authorized Mr. Mike Cox to move forward with putting the project out for bids.
 - 1) The Board approved the recommendation made by the FPS for the AHS Cafeteria Roof Project.
 - Peachtree School Loading Dock project. Mr. Higdon is awaiting plans for this project from Mr. Mike Cox.



- The FPS approved the use of Sales Tax for the purchase of a 2008 F-350 Dump Truck to be used by maintenance for an amount of \$24,689.
- Discussion about obtaining a vehicle to be used by Counselors.
- REMS Chiller Replacement. The FPS approved replacement of the chiller at REMS based on a bid provided with a stipulation that should a lower bid be received that company would be awarded the bid.

- Lastly, Mr. Clonts reported on a request for usage of Article 46 funding to facilitate the costs associated with the Andrews area Summer Day Camp. It was reported by Dr. Conley that \$15,000 was needed to ensure the program could operate.
- Ms. Stephanie Hass presented several budget amendments for consideration. Those amendments were:

- The Budget amendments, usages of sales tax, and application for public school building capital fund usage were approved.
- Next, Ms. Hass provided an overview of the 2017/18 Proposed Local Current Expense Budget Revenues. During her presentation, Ms. Hass covered items that had been included in the budget proposal provided the County Commissioners as well as the changes returned from the Commissioners. At the conclusion of her overview, Ms. Hass announced that she and the Superintendent would be meeting with the Commissioners May 12, 2017 at 10 am at the Courthouse to submit their updated budget proposal.
- Mr. Jeff Tatham delivered the Policy Subcommittee recommendations by announcing policies for second reading. Those policies presented are:

- Following this, Mr. Tatham presented policies to be rescinded:
 - 6226 Charge Policy
 - 7130-R Licensure (Regulatory Policy)
- Dr. Conley delivered a Marble Elementary Feasibility Study for consideration by the Board. Dr. Conley began by explaining the three primary reasons for opening and maintaining a school, those being:
 - Geographical necessity
 - Outstanding performance, and/or
 - Justifiable numbers
- Dr. Conley next identified the three primary reasons a school is closed, those being:
 - Low enrollment
 - Better educational opportunities, and/or
 - Economical considerations
- Having stated these two variables, Dr. Conley went on to provide examples over a 10-year period of declining enrollment at Marble Elementary as well as County wide, and how such impacted available resource distribution to all schools of the County. Dr. Conley also demonstrated how, under the present laws associated with teacher/student ratio, a classroom at Marble elementary would be split into two classrooms with a teacher/student ratio of 1 teacher for 11 students; whereas at Andrews Elementary School the teacher/student ratio would be 1 teacher to 20 students. There was considerable discussion about this study at the end of which the Board approved a Public Hearing to be held at the Marble Springs Baptist Church beginning at 6 pm on May 16, 2017. It was stated also that should the church not be available to host such a public hearing, the cafeteria at Marble Elementary would be used to host the public hearing. It was also stated that the public hearing was not to be a venue at which a decision would be made to keep the school open or order it closed. The purpose was stated to be one of affording the community the opportunity to share their opinions on the matter with the Board of Education.
- Next, Dr. Conley delivered her Superintendent's Report. She began by announced the 2016-2017 School Teachers of the Year. Those being:

- Following this, Dr. Conley announced the District Teacher of the Year as being Cicely Mason.
- Next, Dr. Conley reported that the AHS varsity cheerleaders will be traveling to Hickory July 28 to participate in a cheerleading camp.
- Dr. Conley then reported the following "Good News" items:
- She began by explaining the tomato plants that had been placed before each of the Board Members and reported that the plants had been provided by students who are in the OCS program.
 - 3 Occupational Course of Study programs at our 3 traditional high schools are established. In order to meet the requirements of OCS each program has a school based enterprise.

Hiwassee Dam High School OCS programs has a greenhouse. Students are learning to grow vegetables and flowers and sell their product to members of their community.

Murphy High School OCS program is making and selling all natural dog treats "Bulldog Bites". The students make apple and pumpkin flavored. They are marketing both small and large treats.

Andrews High School OCS program has a t shirt press. Students are creating products for their school as well as their community. They have been asked to do shirts for the Andrews Recreation Department for the Lifeguards.

Students who are in the OCS program are students with significant learning disabilities that impede their opportunity to go to a 4 year college out of high school. This population of students are at risk for dropping out of school. We are rolling out our OCS Handbook this Spring to help key decision makers for the course of study understand the requirements of OCS. The work hours are a huge component of this course of study. I met with Dennis Myers, with IOI, last week and we plan to partner with IOI and Vocational Rehab to have 24 of our students certified as "job ready" when they graduate. This allows them to learn skills at their local school based enterprise, transition to an actual paid employment position within our county. When they graduate, they will have a job!

• She then reported "Good News" items as reported from school Principals:

Andrews Elementary

- Dana Heidbreder was selected as the AES Teacher of the Year. Dana is admired by the staff, parents, and teachers at AES and we are thrilled to have her serve as our representative.
- AES PTA hosted a very successful Spring Fling on April 28th. Over \$3,600 was raised!
- The Pinwheel Tutoring program, an after school program done by Red Oak Church and Snowbird Outfitters, has completed this year's program. Pinwheel was able to provide one-on-one homework help and mentoring for 43 AES students!
- In a recent needs assessment, several parents expressed a desire to learn more about the English language in order to help their children at home. To meet these needs, an after school book chat program involving parents, their children, and quality children's literature has begun and will continue weekly throughout the summer in the school library. These are hosted by ELL coach, Julie Aiken.
- AES had three students compete in the district Modern Woodman speech contest: Kinleigh Queen, Graham Burch, and Austin Bristol.

Andrews High

- Tonya Raper was voted Teacher of the Year by her colleagues.
- 8 AHS students traveled to the NC Sports Hall of Fame in Raleigh. They were able to meet legendary athletes and coaches such as Derrick Whittenberg, Phil Ford, Jim Beatty, Mike Fox, Jerry Moore and Chasity Melvin.
- Track All-Conference winners- Tiffany Holloway: Shot Put (Set a conference record) and Discuss, Morgan Mashburn: Triple Jump and 300m Hurdles, Taylor Parker: Long Jump, Abe Christensen: Shot Put. Many athletes will travel to the Regional meet this weekend.
- Decision Day was a huge success. Colleges both in NC and out will be gaining AHS stars in the fall.

- Savannah Horton was named student representative to the NCSHAA Board for the coming school year. She will have the opportunity to travel to Indianapolis this summer for a leadership institute.
- The office of Rep. Mark Meadows (R-NC) awarded AHS Freshman Juliana Aiken, 3rd place in the 2017 Congressional Art Competition for NC-11!
- Seniors Thomas West and Aaron Young received Honorable Mention at the STAC/STEM-E competition for their creation of a strategic board game. Other AHS projects in the competition included the programming of a videogame and the design and 3D printing of a chess set.
- The AHS STAC club (Student Technology Advisory Council) is becoming STEM // M.A.D.E. (Marine and Aerial Drone Exploration). This club will adapt the goals and practices of STAC into a focus on underwater robotics and unmanned aerial vehicle (drone) flight, and to use these practices in support of our core STEM academics. Over the course of the 17-18 school year, STEM // M.A.D.E. expects to design, build, and launch a remote-operated submersible that can carry modular scientific equipment, and to provide professional-quality drone videography for school and community service. This organization will prepare students for the rapidly changing 21st Century and will help them to be the innovators of future robotics and automation technologies.
- All 5 students enrolled in the CNA course passed their national CNA exam. They were Madison Bias, Kenzie Gunter, Lauren Truett, Bethlyn Jones and Destinee Mathis.
- Dakota Silvers will represent AHS at the state level Special Olympics

Andrews Middle

- Congratulations to Mrs. Camille Brown AMS Teacher of the Year! When students talk about Mrs. Brown they
 do so with a smile. One student's commented, "Mrs. Brown always turns a bad day into a great one...especially
 Mondays."
- Mrs. Brown's science classes were able to collaborate with her friend Elrika Logan, a former secondary Biology teacher, in Liverpool, England using flipgrid (a tool we learned about at the blended learning workshop with Dr. Hervey). She asked students questions about the Urinary System on flipgrid and provided feedback on their responses (she was very impressed). We hope, with her help, to start collaboration with a school in England in the future.
- Students in Mrs. Brown's class sent toilet paper tubes, some plain, some decorated, to National Geographic Kids to assist them in trying to achieve a Guinness Book of World Records for tallest statue made from toilet paper tubes.
- Thank you to Dr. Jeff Taylor for speaking to Mrs. Brown's classes about eyes and then leading students in dissecting sheep eyes.
- National History Day students Joy Wood and Dyanna Holloway won the state competition and are going to the National competition in Washington, DC! They are the first 6th graders to advance to the National Competition. - Mrs. Bennett's DonorsChoose project was funded \$2180 by one donor to purchase 6 tables and 28 chairs for her classroom! The donor funded the furniture in memory of his wife, who was an advocate for public education.
- Our "save the shrew" for Earth Day was successful. We picked up close to 70/80 bags of trash and a couple of TVs. We also found 12 shrew skulls, which raised awareness for the students. Since our pickup, a couple of students have picked up trash on their own and have brought in other skulls they found to their science classes. Students cleaned up along the roads around AMS and along the historic Tatham Gap road, which was part of the Trail of Tears. Thank you to Gary Chamberlain for participating, sharing awareness of litter to students, and providing vests, bags, and grabbers for the event.
- Science and STEM teachers are planning activities with students to ensure they are informed about the upcoming eclipse. Mrs. Alaina Ledford received a grant for 10 solar robots that can be made with used bottles or Aluminum cans, solar USB kits, and solar trackers. The students are going to use them to gain knowledge for the upcoming eclipse and to support the topics of alternative energy being covered in class.
- The 8th grade science class used Makey Makeys to build an interactive, touch-sensitive periodic table of elements. 8th grade science student recently learned about testing for the presence of GMOs and about the Royal Disease of hemophilia with Bionetwork, where they learned about the topic and conducted an experiment to coincide with it.
