

Minutes of the Cherokee County Board of Education Meeting held May 11, 2017 beginning at 6 pm at Central Office

Board Members Present

- 1. <u>Call to Order</u>. Ms. Wanda Arrowood called the Board of Education meeting to order.
- 2. <u>Pledge of Allegiance</u>. Mr. Tim Coffey led the Pledge of Allegiance.
- 3. Mission Statement. Mr. Jeff Tatham read the mission statement.
- 4. Approval of Agenda. The agenda was accepted as presented.
- 5. Approval of Minutes. The Minutes of the April 6, 2017 board meeting were approved as presented.
- 6. Public Input. Ms. Arrowood called for public comment and there was none.
- 7. <u>TCEC Student Presentation</u>. Raymond Hollenbeck and Ryan Shell, students of TCEC, appeared before the Board and delivered a presentation as part of their Senior Capstone project on the use of technology in schools.
- 8. <u>Naming of Facility</u>. Mr. Keith Payne, Assistant Principal of Murphy Middle appeared and presented a request to name the Murphy High School track complex in honor of Ms. Frankie Roberson and Mr. Benny Pipes. It was proposed the track be called "The Roberson-Pipes Track".

Motion made (Mr. Tim Coffey) and seconded (Mr. Winfield Clonts) to approve naming of the Murphy High School track complex in honor of Ms. Frankie Roberson and Mr. Benny Pipes and that it would be henceforth known as "The Roberson-Pipes Track". Voting is unanimous.

9. <u>CTE Strategic Plan and Beginning Teacher Support Program Handbook</u>. Ms. Pam Pressley appeared and presented the CTE Strategic Plan for consideration.

Motion made (Mr. Winfield Clonts) and seconded (Mr. Jeff Tatham) to approve the CTE Strategic Plan as presented by Ms. Pressley. Voting is unanimous.

Next, Ms. Pressley presented the amended Beginning Teacher Support Program Handbook for consideration. During the presentation, Ms. Pressley stated that additional legislation would necessitate changing a single word in the handbook and asked the Board to allow her to make the change without the need of presenting the handbook again for that purpose.

Board of Education Ms. Wanda Arrowood, Chair, Mr. Paul Brown, Vice Chair, Mr. Arnold Mathews, Scribe Mr. Winfield Clonts, Mr. Tim Coffey, Mr. Jeff Tatham, and Mr. Tim West *An Equal Opportunity/Affirmative Action Employer* Motion made (Mr. Winfield Clonts) and seconded (Mr. Paul Brown) to approve the Beginning Teacher Support Program Handbook as presented by Ms. Pressley and to allow Ms. Pressley to make the change should the legislation necessitating such be passed. Voting is unanimous.

10. <u>2017/2018 Calendar Approval</u>. Dr. Conley presented the proposed calendars for the district as well as TCEC for consideration. There was some discussion about the development of the calendar, focusing on 1,025 hours of instruction as opposed to 180 days, and the start date.

Motion made (Mr. Winfield Clonts) and seconded (Mr. Paul Brown) to approve the District Calendar as presented by the Superintendent. Voting is unanimous.

Motion made (Mr. Paul Brown) and seconded (Mr. Winfield Clonts) to approve the TCEC Calendar as presented by the Superintendent. Voting is unanimous.

11. <u>Financial Planning Update</u>. Mr. Winfield Clonts reported several items that were discussed during the subcommittee meeting. The first item discussed was awarding of the Milk Contract to the Mayfield Co.

Motion made (Mr. Winfield Clonts) and seconded (Mr. Tim Coffey) to approve awarding the milk contract to the Mayfield Company as proposed by the Financial Planning Subcommittee. Voting is unanimous.

Following this, Mr. Clonts addressed the AHS Cafeteria Roof Project and recommended that the Board approve the services of Mr. Mike Cox as the project coordinator.

Motion made (Mr. Winfield Clonts) and seconded (Mr. Jeff Tatham) to employ Mr. Mike Cox to facilitate the AHS Cafeteria Roof Project as explained by the Financial Planning Subcommittee and design and put out for bids the repair of the roof structure using the membrane system. Voting is unanimous.

Next, Mr. Clonts addressed items the Financial Planning Subcommittee had approved to be added to the Budget Request. Those items are:

- The use of Sales Tax for the purchase of a 2008 F-350 Dump Truck to be used by maintenance for an amount of \$24,689.
- Discussion about obtaining a vehicle to be used by Counselors.
- The replacement of the chiller at REMS based on a bid provided with a stipulation that should a lower bid be received that company would be awarded the bid.

Motion made (Mr. Arnold Mathews) and seconded (Mr. Paul Brown) to approve the budget amendments, usage of ½ cent and ¼ cent sales taxes, and NC Education Lottery fund application as presented by Ms. Hass. Voting is unanimous.

Following the Budget Request, Ms. Hass provided an overview of the 2017/18 Proposed Local Current Expense Budget Revenue. During her presentation, Ms. Hass covered items that had been included in the budget proposal provided the County Commissioners as well as the changes returned from the Commissioners. At the conclusion of her overview, Ms. Hass announced that she and the Superintendent would be meeting with the Commissioners May 12, 2017 at 10 am at the Courthouse to submit their updated budget proposal.

- 14. <u>Marble Elementary Feasibility Study</u>. Dr. Conley presented a Marble Elementary Feasibility study for consideration by the Board. There was much discussion about this study. At the conclusion of the presentation, the Board ordered there be a Public Hearing during which the people of Marble Community would be afforded the opportunity to voice their opinions on the matter.

Motion made (Mr. Paul Brown) and seconded (Mr. Tim West) to schedule a public hearing to receive public comment on the closure of Marble Elementary School pursuant to North Carolina General Statute 115C-72, and to authorize the Superintendent to publish notice of the same, to be held at Marble Springs Baptist Church (if available, and if not, in a suitable place inside Marble Elementary), at 6 pm on Tuesday, May 16, 2017, the notice to specify that the purpose of the hearing is solely to take public comment and no Board action will be taken. Voting is unanimous.
